Cities throughout the country are requiring site plan reviews with crime prevention in mind. Law Enforcement, Planners, Architects, City Officials, and Educators are working to ensure the proper design of structures, parks, public transportation, neighborhoods and schools. Participants will learn the different aspects of lighting, access control and the effects of natural design on human behavior. Participants will work together on a site survey utilizing CPTED strategies and the advantages of having a CPTED ordinance and how to construct and present it to lawmakers.

Art Hushen is the President/Owner of the NICP, Inc. and was assigned to the Tampa Police Department's Special Operations Bureau / CPTED Section where he retired from in 2006. He was instrumental in the creation of the Department's CPTED Unit and Tampa's first CPTED Ordinance for the Westshore Business District, the largest Business District in Florida. He implemented the CPTED review process for the Tampa Parks Department Greenways and Trails Master Plan. He worked with the Tampa Housing Authority on their Hope VI program and was part of the task force implementing design guidelines.

Art received his Crime Prevention Practitioner Certification and CPTED Designation through the Florida Crime Prevention Training Institute where he assisted in the creation of the Advanced CPTED program and the State standards for the CPTED Designation. He is an instructor for the Florida Attorney General's Office and the American Institute of Crime Prevention specializing in Basic & Advanced CPTED, and CPTED in schools. Art is recognized as a Crime Prevention Specialist through the International Society of Crime Prevention Practitioners and is a graduate of the National Crime Prevention Institute, Fox Valley College, and the American Crime Prevention Institute in both Basic and Advanced CPTED. Art holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Criminology from the University of South Florida. Art has conducted seminars and training through the United States and has been a guest speaker / trainer in Canada, South America, the Caribbean, the United Kingdom, and Europe.
